CVSD MIDDLE SCHOOLS

Is renovating Horizon Middle School actually necessary?

- Horizon was built in the 1980's – over 35 years ago – and subsequently the **modern learning and safety standards have changed significantly.**
- School capacity would be increased from 480 to **accommodate 600 students.**
- The school **currently has inadequate air conditioning** and therefore not optimal for learning.
- Building renovations would **upgrade to current codes**, technology and **safety standards**; add a secure vestibule with increased visibility throughout, refresh the building exterior to clarify where the entry is, as well as improving the bus and parent drop off.

What are we doing about North Pines Middle School?

- Good stewardship of the 2015 bond dollars means CVSD can **build a new North Pines Middle School with 2015 dollars.** Construction is now underway and will be completed once the state's capital budget is approved. North Pines will be completed, even if it is delayed due to the budget process.
- The new building will have an updated learning environment, including a **secure vestibule entrance** providing visual access to the commons and parent drop-off.

Why do we need another new Middle School?

- Our district continues to grow, middle school is no exception. It is actually growing faster than originally anticipated.
- CVSD's projected middle school enrollment in the fall of 2020 is 3,580 students. Current enrollment is 3,180 students. Middle school capacity is 3,125 students.
